# Introduction

## About this Guide

This guide walks you through the Ipro Eclipse SE™ product upgrade. In this document, a “feature”<sup>1</sup> describes an individual functional area in Ipro Eclipse SE, including:

- **Eclipse SE Administration:** Used by administrators to define and manage all aspects of Eclipse SE, ranging from case set-up to production.
- **Eclipse SE Desktop:** Used by reviewers to view and annotate case documents (apply tags, redact content, etc.).
- **Eclipse SE Print Manager:** This optional feature allows users to send print jobs to a central print manager, thus freeing up personal computer resources.
- **Ipro Publish:** Ipro Publish allows you to create a standalone version of an Eclipse SE case from an Eclipse SE case or load files from Eclipse or other sources. This standalone version can be used by reviewers outside of your Eclipse SE environment.



**NOTE:** If you have purchased any of the following optional modules, they will be installed/updated in conjunction with the upgrade of Eclipse SE Desktop and/or Administration (as applicable):

- Scanning module<sup>2</sup>: Enables scanning from the Eclipse SE Desktop.
- Summation Migration module<sup>3</sup>: Allows AccessData® Summation® cases to be migrated directly into Eclipse SE via Eclipse SE Administration; see the following paragraph.
- SE Streaming module<sup>4</sup>: Provides faster native file ingestion in Eclipse SE Administration; also includes deduplication and other native file ingestion features.

## Authorization Considerations

- If you are installing the Eclipse SE Scanning, Summation Migration, and/or SE Streaming module for the first time, note that they must be authorized through the Ipro Authorization Server (not through local authorization).
- If you are implementing the Authorization Server for the first time, see the *Ipro Authorization Server Installation Guide* and the *Ipro Eclipse SE Installation Guide*.
- To update authorization, see [“Remote Authorization”](#).

# Upgrading Ipro Eclipse SE

## Preparation



**IMPORTANT!** It is *essential* that you complete the following procedures before upgrading Ipro Eclipse SE. Each procedure is discussed in the following paragraphs.

- Obtain current settings.
- Determine your upgrade method.
- Back up all data.
- Ensure that **all** users are logged out of Ipro Eclipse SE.
- Obtain installation package.

## Obtaining Current Settings

Before starting the upgrade, ensure that you have your Eclipse SE configuration details, including **System Directory**, **Eclipse SE Admin UserID/Password** (Super Administrator credentials), and other settings.

## Identifying Super Administrator Credentials

Only a Super Administrator can upgrade Eclipse SE. Make sure you have needed Super Administrator credentials before you start the upgrade.

## Determining Upgrade Method

It is possible to upgrade Ipro Eclipse SE using the method used for initial installation:

- Setup Wrapper
- Silent Upgrade
- Administrative Upgrade

This guide describes the use of the Setup Wrapper. For other methods, follow the same procedures as the initial installation. Refer to the *Ipro Eclipse SE Installation Guide* as needed.



**NOTE:** Depending on the release from which you are upgrading, Eclipse SE prerequisites may need to be upgraded. The upgrade is automatic when you use the Setup Wrapper or a silent installation, but the prerequisites will typically not be upgraded automatically for an administrative installation. In this case, run the software packages manually on each workstation.

The packages are located in the ISSetupPrerequisites folder provided with the upgrade package.

## Backing up data

It is important to create a backup of all existing data prior to beginning the upgrade process. Data on any previous releases can be restored if you run into a problem. For more information, see the Eclipse SE help on the [Ipro Help Center](#).

## Checking for active users

	<p><b>CAUTION:</b> Make sure that all users have logged out of all Ipro Eclipse SE applications before beginning the upgrade. You can verify that all users are out of the system by completing the following procedure.</p>
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To verify that all users are out of the system:

1. Start Eclipse SE Administration and log in as a Super Administrator.
2. Click the **System Management** tab.
3. In the navigation panel, expand the **System Management** menu and click **Manage User Sessions**.
4. Alert users to log out of the system (now or at a specified time).
5. Review connection details for users remaining in the system:
  - **Software Module:** The module that is open by the session. For example, ECLIPSE\_VIEWER represents the Eclipse SE Desktop.
  - **Session ID:** Open session number.
  - **User:** The user who is currently accessing the system.
  - **Case:** The case in which the user is currently working.
  - **Last Accessed:** The last time the module was accessed.

The following figure shows typical details.

6. Contact active users and instruct them a) to log off and b) *not* to log on until they are notified that all upgrade procedures have been completed.
7. When all connections have been addressed, click **Done**.
8. After the upgrade is complete, notify users that they can resume work.

## Obtaining latest installation package

Download the Eclipse SE installation package from the [MyIpro](#) software download location. Unzip the package to a convenient location.

## Upgrade Procedure (Setup Wrapper)

Complete the following steps to upgrade or install Eclipse SE components at your site:



**NOTE:** if your upgrade includes installing the Eclipse SE Print Manager for the first time, it is recommended that it be installed on a workstation that is separate from other Eclipse SE modules.

1. Complete "[Preparation](#)".
2. Locate and double-click Eclipse SE's **setup.exe**.
3. Follow all Install Wizard prompts to complete the upgrade.
4. Repeat this procedure for all workstations with licensed installations of Ipro Eclipse SE modules.
5. See "[Case Update Details](#)," next, to complete the upgrade.
6. If you are upgrading from a version prior to Eclipse SE 2014.0.0 or if you are installing the Eclipse SE Scanning, Summation Migration, and/or SE Streaming module for the first time, you must update product authorizations as explained in [Updating Ipro Authorization](#).

## Case Update Details

### Deduplication criteria

If you will be using the SE Streaming for native file ingestion and you want to perform deduplication, note that deduplication works for documents added to a case in Eclipse SE 2016.3.2 or later. Documents added to the case prior to this release are not included in the deduplication database and thus will not be compared.

### Upgrading from version 2014.1.0 – 2017.3.6

No special tasks are required when you upgrade to 2017.4.0 from any version of Eclipse SE between 2014.1.0 and version 2016.3.6.



**NOTE:** When you upgrade from a version prior to 2015.1.0, the PAGECNT field is renamed to "IMAGECNT." This change is automatic; no action is required by the user.

### Upgrading from versions 2014.0.1 and earlier

Beginning with version 2014.1.0, the MD5\_HASH and IMAGECNT (see note above) fields will be defined

as sortable (by default) when cases are created. In addition, changes have been made to the way in which data is displayed in the **Tally** tab when a multi-value field is tallied. (Each value will display on a separate line.)

To implement these changes in existing cases, rebuild case indexes. For more information, see the Eclipse SE help on the [Ipro Help Center](#).

## Upgrading from version 2013.1.0

If you are upgrading from an Eclipse SE version 2013.1.0, you must manage file paths and system fields. For more information, see the Eclipse SE help on the [Ipro Help Center](#).

## Upgrading from versions prior to 2013.1.0

If you are upgrading from an Eclipse SE version prior to 2013.1.0, you must complete add new system fields to your cases. For more information, see the Eclipse SE help on the [Ipro Help Center](#).

New fields include:

- FILE\_ID
- NATIVE\_SIZE
- TEXT\_SIZE

In addition, if a FILETYPE field exists in your case, it will be changed to the FILE\_EXT file type and populated with the file extensions detected by Eclipse SE during the validation process.

## Updating Ipro Authorization

Re-authorization is required if you are upgrading from Eclipse SE releases prior to 2013.1.0, are installing the Eclipse SE Scanning, Summation Migration, or SE Streaming module for the first time, and in certain other situations.

Complete one of the following procedures to re-authorize Eclipse SE:

- Local authorization:
  - Internet-based
  - Email-based
- Remote authorization: if the Ipro Authorization Server is installed at your site (because you are using Ipro for enterprise products or have the Scanning, Summation Migration, or SE Streaming module), use the Authorization Server to authorize Eclipse SE.

### Local Authorization

To authorize Eclipse SE:

1. After upgrading Eclipse SE modules, start Eclipse SE Administration on the authorization computer (the computer on which authorization originally occurred).
2. Log in as a Super Administrator.
3. Click the **System Management** tab.
4. In the navigation panel, expand the **System Management** menu and click **System Authorization**.

All previous authorization settings will be read by the authorization component of Eclipse SE Administration and listed in this dialog box.

5. Complete the below steps to re-authorize Eclipse SE.

**If Internet access is available:**

- a. Click Remote Authorization Update. Authorization will occur automatically, typically within a few minutes. When authorization is completed, the Manage System Authorization dialog box details will be updated to reflect new information. You will also receive an email from Ipro Customer Service indicating the authorization update was successful.
- b. Click **Done**.

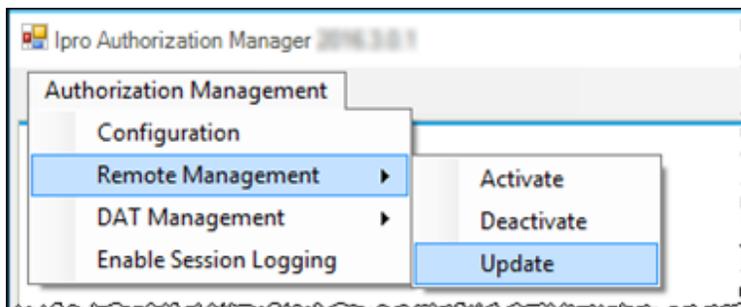
**If Internet access is *not* available:**

- a. Click Export Authorization File.
- b. Navigate to a location where you want to save the authorization (.DAT) file and click **Save**.
- c. E-mail the resulting .DAT file (unzipped) to Ipro Customer Service at [CSR@iprotech.com](mailto:CSR@iprotech.com). Enter “Eclipse SE Authorization Request” in the e-mail Subject line. Ipro’s Customer Service will authorize the .DAT file and return a registered .DAT data file.
- d. Save the file received from Ipro Customer Service to a location accessible by Eclipse SE Administration.
- e. On the System Management ribbon, click **System Authorization**.
- f. In the Manage System Authorization dialog box, click **Import/Load Authorization File**.
- g. Navigate to and select the registered data file, then click **Open**. At this point, the system is authorized.
- h. Click **Done**.

## Remote Authorization

Complete the following steps when re-authorization is needed for Eclipse SE, and the Authorization Server is being used to manage your Eclipse SE licenses:

1. On the Authorization Server, navigate to the Ipro Auth Server directory.
2. Double-click **IproAuthManager.exe**. The Ipro Authorization Service Manager starts.
3. Select **Authorization Management > Remote Management > Update** as shown here.



4. Follow the screen prompts. Eclipse SE authorization will be updated and an email notice will be sent regarding authorization status.

Authorization remains in effect according to the terms of your licensing agreement. Beginning one week before authorization will expire, a warning will display when users log in to either Eclipse SE Desktop or Administration.
